


World Communion Sunday

What is Spiritual Direction?

On every retreat I have attended, even as a youth, I loved the spaces for quiet time and contemplation. The space away from the singing and talking (which I also love!) has always felt so sacred. It has taken me many years to develop a strong and consistent spiritual discipline. Now, I welcome the early hours in prayer when the house is quiet and the day is fresh. Likely there are days when your name is on my lips as I offer praises and concerns to God. Over the past two years, I have benefited greatly from walking closely with my own spiritual director. I meet with her monthly and she guides me into a holy space where I learn to listen more deeply for God's meaning for my life.

A few months ago I saw an advertisement to enter a Spiritual Direction program through Oasis Ministries, an affiliate of Princeton Seminary. I applied for the program and I was accepted. The program consists of an opening prayer retreat (September 25–26), a closing retreat in May, and a monthly meeting with other people in my cohort. Honestly, I knew I needed more time in silence and prayer in my life and the structure offered in this program will help me to carve out room in my schedule in an intentional way. Throughout the program, I look forward to sharing new ideas and practices of contemplation with you.

For those who are curious, Spiritual Direction is not counseling, but instead, it is a practice of meditation and focus to listen to a deeper core and to learn to be able to block out the noise of the world to find truth and peace through Christian spiritual practice.
